She felt that for some people, the meaning has been lost, and it has become just another long weekend.







"This is the first year we have tried this," she says, "so we kept it simple. Change of Format for Bannockburn Arts Festival this year

The Arts Central sub-committee organising the Bannockburn Arts Festival Across the Bridge have made the call to change the format for 2022.

This year, they will host an Art School in Bannockburn, offering week-long classes in the visual arts - drawing, creativity development, watercolour painting, acrylic painting and photography - creative writing, writing your family story and poetry.

There will also be a wine masterclass tutored by our local winemakers, and a cook's tour.

The school is scheduled for Monday, October 3 till Friday, October 7, and will be followed by the now well-established Cairnmuir Woolshed Art Exhibition, spotlighting the professional artists of Bannockburn.

After having to cancel the wonderful Art Festival planned for 2021, organisers have

decided that for this year an art school format, with restricted numbers and featuring tutors from the Central Otago Region, would be a safer format for this year.

The plan is to return to a festival format in 2023, and then make the decision whether to perhaps alternate between the formats going forward.

Jan Hudson, sub-committee member, says she is excited by the quality of the tutors they have managed to attract.

"We are keen to keep up the momentum of the last ten years for our annual celebration of all that Bannockburn has to offer.

Stunning autumn days with a bite of cold in the morning and sunny afternoons signal that we are coming to the end of a very long and challenging school term. I for one am very ready for a break from managing staffing levels through the Omicron outbreak. I sincerely hope that the holidays will provide a circuit breaker and we will see cases for our community slow and reduce when we come back for term 2.

Nearly 50% of our staff and our students have been affected by Covid since the beginning of March. Most people who start out as household contacts later test positive. Many of these on day 7 or 8 of isolating. It has been a real challenge for households where children have tested positive a week apart and parents have had to take multiple periods of leave to be at home with their children while they recover.

It has also been a huge challenge to keep our school fully open with many staff away sick and isolating. Classes have been split, children have worked with different teachers and different groups of children. I've even had to dust off my skills and tackle the chalk face.

There have been some positives to come from the ways we have been working. Splitting classes and having plans in place to keep learning going for our students has led to genuine collaboration between teachers. Teachers are taking collective responsibility for all the students in their team. They are getting to know them better and making sure their programmes and practices are shared so that other teachers can maintain learning for all the children.

Equally children are demonstrating resilience and adaptability. They are comfortable across a range of classes with different teachers and groups of children that they might not usually be with. They are managing different routines and learning environments with aplomb.

I know schools are not unique in having to deal with the challenges of this outbreak. Managing staffing levels and the impact on businesses has also been huge. I'm sure as in my situation there have been some positives to come from challenging situations like staff stepping up and taking on extra responsibilities and supporting one another. We all need to remember to reach out and give ourselves permission to accept support when we need it and we will get through this together.

Family Fun Day to celebrate 131 year-year-old church building

The Cromwell Methodist Church building was officially opened on 17 April 1891, which makes it 131 years old on Easter Sunday.

The Otago Goldfields Heritage Trust (OGHT) has been based in the building since 2006. It was unable to celebrate the 130th last year, due to covid restrictions, but now has a 'Family Funday' planned.

OGHT treasurer Odette Hopgood-Bride says, "We are planning a wee party to celebrate the birthday. It's the plainest of the four churches in the block, but she has some great heritage."

The land was purchased in 1890. William Gere and Leslie Arthur were the stonemasons of this and many other of the heritage buildings in the region. William married one of the Marsh Sisters, so there is a connection between this and McNulty House.

Leslie Arthur is the great-grandfather of former prime minister of New Zealand Helen Clark.

The Trust has been preparing to buy the building, situated on the corner of Erris and Donegal Streets in Old Cromwell, over the last five years, and Odette says, "We really do need to preserve it, and keep it for the community. We've put a lot of work into it."

Central Otago District Council contracted Naylor Love of Queenstown to carry out the sculpture repaint at Cromwell's entrance.


Work started last Thursday and was expected to take about 10 days.

Central Otago District Council Parks and Recreation Manager Gordon Bailey said he hoped work would be completed by Monday weather permitting.

"Weather is the challenge."

People would be seeing the same sculpture but revitalised, he said.

"The fruit colours will be refreshed and more vibrant." The paint treatment method being used would minimise fading by the sun and extend the frequency the fruit needed to be repainted.



Two bids were received in response to the advertised tender, and both were within the allocated budget for the work.

The cost is just under \$80,000.

One of the apprentices was a young woman, and one of the judges was Cromwell builder and previous winner, Brie Cook.

Brie won the Regional Apprentice of the Year title in 2021 and went on to compete in the national competition.

She says the experience gave her confidence and really brought home to her that she had what it takes to be a good builder.

"Being up at the nationals and meeting other tradies, both men and women, highlighted how much I've learned, all the skills I've developed, how much I enjoy building and that I am good at what I do."

The experience also cemented Brie's resolve to encourage other women into





trades, and she was pleased to see that one of the apprentices competing was a woman.

Stefanie Panko is an apprentice at CBG Quality Construction. She said the competition was a lot of fun, and she enjoyed testing her skills against other apprentices over the eight-hour challenge. Stefanie said she first got into building because she thought it was a valuable skill to learn.

"I was only going to do it to learn to make stuff at home, but I enjoy it so much, and there's just so many directions you can a building career, I'm here to stay."

Business owner Clint Gollop says Stef joined them late last year, after a long search for the right candidate.

"It makes good business sense to bring different strengths to the table.

Stef carries a lot of the values and skills that we need in the team.

"There's a real misconception out there that women not being as strong as men is a hindrance, but I disagree with that. Being a good builder is about so much more than physical strength."

Rosemary Riddell, author of To be Fair: Confessions of a District Court Judge, will address the next meeting of the Cromwell University of the Third Age meeting in Cromwell Town and Country Club.

Her stories are peppered with humour and


compassion, and she is open about her own family tragedy.





