CHAIRS COMMENT

I had the pleasure of talking with the team from Radio New Zealand last week about the Lake Dunstan Cycle Trail. What a fabulous opportunity to talk about our town and the asset that the Queenstown Cycle Trail Trust has provided for our community. Nearly 85,000 people have used the track since it opened in May last year. A number that completely outstrips even the most optimistic of projections.

I know that most of the focus has been on the section of the track from Cornish Point to Clyde to take in the magnificent cantilevered cycleways and bridge structures. I met with RNZ up at Carrick to highlight the wonderful riding and views that wend their way around the lake edge from Smiths Way, through Pisa Moorings and Old Cromwell before climbing up to Cornish Point. Plenty of great riding, great views and of course great places to stop for food and refreshments along the way.

The connection of tracks through to the Bannockburn wineries and from the Gibbston Valley and Wanaka will make Cromwell a hub for people on biking holidays as they connect through our district with day rides from one town to the next.

We need to keep having the conversation about how we encourage these visitors to stay awhile and enjoy our town and not just be picked up by the van and onto somewhere else.

Lot 47 - Topping Education Scholarship Fund



The Cromwell Rotary and Lions Clubs house build fundraising project, Lot 47, made \$824,436.88 profit.

Doreen Evans never dreamed such a result would be achieved when sharing her vision of how the community could support Cromwell St John's new station build. She said the result was due to the support of so many businesses including, CHP Developments, S J Allen, Central Concrete Placing, Expol, Complete Reinforcing, McNulty's and Pumpcrete 2010.

\$100,000 of the profit was used to create the Topping Education Scholarship Fund

Vicky Topping said she was involved with St John Cromwell in 1990 when they moved into a new building. The old one was removed/destroyed by the dam project. Vicky said she was excited to be involved in Cromwell St John's new station build in 2020-21.

Les Topping started his engineering career as a cadet in Dunedin in 1971 where he commenced working on the motorway construction and survey for the lower Waitaki Irrigation Scheme.

The first of many steps that lead him to project manage the build stage of this fundraising project. Doreen said without his skills the build would not have gone as smoothly and quickly as it did.

Aileen Gamboa-Evans is a lucky recipient of the Topping Education Scholarship Fund. Aileen is studying a Bachelor of Nursing at

Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology. Aileen said becoming a nurse is not simply about a job or career choice.

It is a calling. She says she will go above and beyond to make sure every patient feels that they are not alone when ill. She will ensure patients get the best care possible with respect and dignity. While bringing up two daughters Aileen has been working 20 hours a week for Health Care New Zealand looking after people with brain and spinal injuries in their own home. She also does house cleaning and gardening for people who are unable to do it themselves.

Vicky understands how important hard work and dedication is to become a good nurse and believes Aileen does also.

Ahead of next month's full AWE (At the World's Edge) Festival 2022 programme announcement, organisers have selected Eva Bedggood as their inaugural AWE Emerging Composer.

Eva won the nationwide competition, open to composers 20 years and younger, and will receive personalised mentoring over the next six months from AWE Mentoring Composer Salina Fisher - the Festival's 2021 Composer in Residence.

With Salina's mentoring in the build up to the Festival, Eva will be supported to write a short new string chamber work to be performed within the AWE 2022 Festival programme, and to 2000+ primary and secondary students throughout the Central Lakes region.

Eva will also attend the festival, work with the musicians performing her new piece and personally present it at the performances.

Festival Director Justine Cormack says, "We are thrilled for Eva and simply can't wait to see and hear what she composes. It will be wonderful to welcome her to the Central Lakes in October. Until then, our congratulations go to Eva!"

Eva is currently studying towards a BMus in Composition and Classical Performance (trumpet, piano) at Te Kōkī New Zealand School of Music, Victoria University of Wellington.

"On first hearing that I'd been selected as the AWE Festival 2022 Emerging Composer, I was so ecstatic that I literally jumped up and down on the spot!" says Eva.

As a Student Ambassador for CSO, Eva has performed alongside the CSO and NZSO, and has also performed as a member of UCCYO and The All Girl Big Band.

In 2022 she was awarded an Inspire Foundation grant, and hopes to pursue a career in film music composition.

She says, "I am so grateful to be given the chance to be part of a community of composers during the festival period and also really look forward to working with the musicians who will be performing my new work. I can't wait."

At the World's Edge Festival was held for the first time in 2021, with a wonderful programme of national and international musicians, performed in our local area, as well as in Wanaka and Queenstown. AWE 2022 will be held in October.

Lorelle McNaughton in Concert

Considered one of the most technically demanding and brilliant works for solo piano, Albéniz's *Iberia* is a sumptuous musical evocation of Spain. Together with works by fellow Spanish composers, Granados and de Fall, and by Debussy, New Zealand pianist Lorelle McNaughton takes us on a colourful and varied guided tour in her concert in the Coronation Hall on June 8.

Lorelle says, "I learnt my first piano piece while I was a high school student, choosing what to include in my ATCL diploma exam. As soon as I heard Albéniz's 'Navarra', which was on the list of set pieces, I fell in love with the expressive melodies, the evocative colours, and the dance-like interjections reminiscent of flamenco music. I then went on to study piano at university and

one of my teachers there, Natalia Ricci, shared the same passion for Spanish music and encouraged me to learn more of the repertoire."

Lorelle continued her postgraduate studies with Natalia Ricci at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, and from there was granted scholarships to undertake research at the Academia Marshall in Barcelona.

"This was an incredible experience," she says, "given the rich history of the school which was founded in 1901 by Granados himself and passed down through a lineage of students including famous Spanish pianist Alicia de Larrocha who my teacher, Marta Zabaleta studied with."

Lorelle moved to Spain, studying a Master of Spanish Music at the academy. She says, "I was able to immerse myself

in the Spanish culture and atmosphere including the vibrant and passionate flamenco art form, which emerged from the gypsy quarters of Southern Spain. Their works truly encapsulate the spirit of Spain."

In 2015, she was awarded the prize for Best Interpretation of Spanish Music at the Barcelona Piano Academy, and locals teachers praised her for her understanding of the Spanish repertoire, some even claiming that she must have been a gypsy in a former life.

Lorelle says, "I'm excited to be presenting this music across Aotearoa and to hopefully inspire listeners to explore more of this wonderful repertoire."

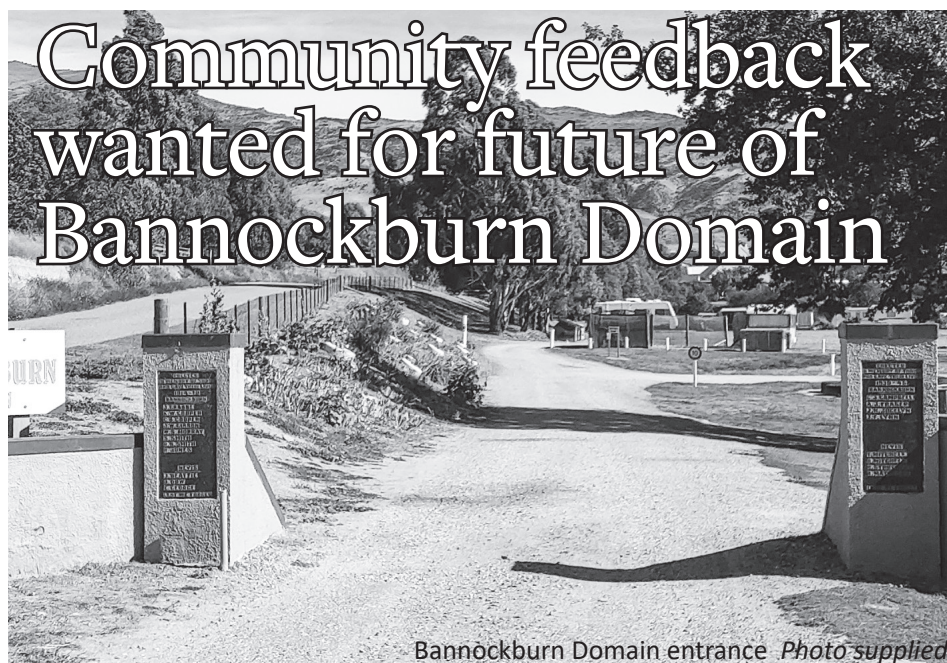

The Cromwell Community Board is encouraging the community to help shape a plan for Bannockburn's only Council reserve.

The Draft Bannockburn Domain Reserve Management Plan 2022 opens for a two-month consultation period from Thursday 26 May. The purpose of the plan is to guide Council operations and provide provisions for things to happen on the domain in the future.

Parks Officer – Planning and Strategy Dr Nikki Aaron said it was the first time the plan had been renewed since 2000.

"A lot has changed in Bannockburn during this time, and we are keen to hear what the community would like to see for the future of the Bannockburn Domain."

The draft plan has been prepared in consultation with key current domain users and has designated the camping ground as the primary use of the domain.

"We are interested in understanding if this is still how the wider community wants to see the domain used," Dr Aaron

said. "What do people think about the other features of the domain – the sports ground, bowling club, playground and tennis courts? What do people cherish about the space now and envisage for how it might be used in the future?"

A drop-in session will be held at the Bannockburn Bowling Club on Tuesday 14 June from 4-6pm. Everyone with an interest in the future of the Bannockburn Domain is invited to get along to discuss your thoughts for its future with Council parks and community engagement staff and elected members. Chat to the team over a cuppa and a biscuit, and reminisce about the area's history by checking out a slideshow of Bannockburn photos from the Ron Murray Photographic Collection.

We have a community that is full of keen hunters and firearm enthusiasts that are well aware of the rules and obligations in relation to them being a fit and proper person to hold a firearms licence.

There have recently been a number of incidents that have been reported of poaching which is bitterly disappointing. On a recent occasion Cromwell Police have one male before the Court after he was caught red handed poaching. Enquiries in relation to this have revealed that he has previously illegally shot and killed a trophy stag worth over \$25000. Due to this information numerous search warrants have been executed in different locations and more serious charges have been laid.

If you or a member of your family are keen hunters, please make sure that you have the land owners permission to enter their property to hunt. They are reasonable people and are mostly only to happy to oblige your requests. It is also a massive safety issue as he may have given permission for someone else to be hunting.

Also make sure that you have a firearms licence and all of your hunting mates have one too. Our friend who shot the trophy stag didn't have one and now his friend that loaned him the weapon is having to answer some serious questions.

By following these common sense rules it allows everyone to play the game safely and soundly

“They put on a lot of events especially for women, and as you get older they target you a bit more so that you keep going. Running makes you feel younger than what you actually are, which is really good.”

Bernie previously worked as a cleaner for another commercial cleaning company, and then as a cleaner at her son’s school.

She made the switch to CrestClean after a health scare prompted her to reevaluate her future.
