Cromwell Pool to reopen for school holidays

The Cromwell Pool, which has been closed for a heating upgrade, is expected to re-open in time for the Term 2 school holidays on Saturday 9 July.

Central Otago District Council Parks and Recreation Manager Gordon Bailey said it was hoped the pool would be back in action on Wednesday 22 June. However, the date needed to be pushed out until 4 July, a few days before the end of Term 2. The extra time would give the team time to complete the work, he said.

"We hoped to avoid this situation by ordering the required equipment well ahead of time but unfortunately due to unforeseen circumstances out of our control vital equipment has yet to arrive.

"With the current situation regarding freight from other countries, we have a number of items which were due on site that are still on the water. This has had a knock-on effect to work we can carry on with because of the sequencing of the

The Cromwell Pool's LPG boiler is being replaced with a centralised water-sourced heating system that uses the town water supply as the heat source. Work began mid-April.

"We have had news from the supplier about the heat exchangers and one of the pumps, that these items are delayed and only due into Lyttleton port

(Friday 3 June), therefore we are unlikely to see them on site until Monday 13 June. With the follow-on works required after installing these items along with commissioning the system I believe we will need the minimum of an extra week to complete everything properly to have the pool up and running."

The Term 2 holidays run from 9-24 July 2022, with Swim School start at the beginning of Term 3 Monday 25 July.

Roast for 20 minutes or until tender.

Citrus Vinaigrette

11/2 oranges juiced & zested (keep the other 1/2 for the the duck glaze)

- 1 lemon juiced & zested
- 1 TBS honey
- 2 TBS Dijon mustard
- 3 TBS water
- 2 TBS Apple Cider vinegar

Whisk all ingredients together. Yes, there is no oil, which makes it really refreshing.

Orange Glaze

½ an orange, juiced & zested 3 TBS brown sugar, mix well Citrus Glazed Duck Breast 2 Duck breast (available at NW)

- Pre heat oven to 180 C.
- Pat the duck breast dry with a paper towel.
- With a sharp knife score the skin and season well with salt & pepper.
- Place the duck skin side down in a cold pan with no oil.
- · Turn on the pan to a medium heat and gently cook for 8-10 minutes until the fat is rendered and the skin is golden and crispy. Don't rush this step. The duck will release a lot of fat great for roasted vegetables.
- · Turn over the duck breast and sear for 1 minute.

Remove duck from pan, baste with glaze and cook for 8 more minutes at 180C, rest for 6 min before slicing against the grain.

Drizzle duck with any additional glaze once sliced.

To plate, arrange duck slices, add dressed salad leaves aside and top with pickled pear, roasted butternut, crumbled goats cheese and toasted chopped nuts. Drizzle a little dressing over the whole dish.





Next school holidays, from 9 to 17 July, local girls Molly Mexted and Amy Pearson will join a group of 50 keen students from around New Zealand on an 8-day residential course in photography, at a Brookfield Outdoor Education Centre, in Wainuiomata, Wellington.

This will be the fifth year that scouts have attended the course from our local Cromwell Scout Group, as the success of past students spreads by word of mouth.

The course was set up in 2006 by Wellington-based digital artist and carver Norm Heke, who recognised a gap in the opportunities offered to Scouts. He wanted to give Scouts a way to discover whether they were interested in pursuing photography as a career.

Over the 16 years of offering the course, 315 youth aged 13-18 years have taken the opportunity to learn about photography,

to improve their creative and technical ability and to explore its potential career opportunities.

The programme includes lots of practical photography, a visit to a local farm to photograph animals, light painting at night, street photography in Wellington City, and presentations from several guest speakers on particular areas of photography.

For the past 10 years, the New Zealand Defense Force has sent one of their photographers along to assist with tutoring.

Many students continue their photography education when they return to they secondary school studies, and some have continued with photography or media studies at tertiary level.

Molly Mexted, who has been working hard to raise the total funds for the course, says, "I'm really looking forward to attending the school to learn more about photography. I have had an interest in photography for several years, having spent time with Dad taking photographs."

Molly is looking forward to learning to fully use a digital camera, and to discover Adobe Lightroom software to select images. The goal is that each student produces a portfolio of 15 of their top images, which they can share with their friends back at Scouts and Guides.

"Spending a week in Wellington making new friends is exciting and a little scary," says Molly.

Having worked on grape harvest to raise money for her journey, Molly is now selling pea straw at \$10 a bale to complete her fundraising.

This will allow improved access to oral health care at reduced cost thereby decreasing the financial burden on the patient

Vicky Topping said in the days when the Cromwell St John team were all volunteers they provided 24/7 cover for the Cromwell District. Monthly training sessions by the Alexandra paramedic was an essential part of the volunteers on-going professional development. Today having more paramedics operating from the Cromwell Station allows flexibility to better meet the



needs of the community, said Vicky. However, the lack of a 24/7 service is concerning, said Doreen Evans.

Did you know that Les Topping, who project managed the Lot 47 build, decided, after working on the dam for 10 years, to have a change of direction? He and Vicky brought a milk run - to everyone's surprise! Yes, Les' nick name became "Ernie" for a number of years.



CODC rates set for 2022-23



The Central Otago District Council rates have been set with the adoption of the 2022-23 Annual Plan at the Council meeting at Alexandra on Wednesday 1 June.

Having not signalled any significant changes for year two of the Council's 2021-2031 Long-term Plan, which involved an extensive public consultation, there was no requirement to consult on the2022-23Annual Plan.

In adopting the Long-term Plan (LTP), the average rates increase was predicted to reach 7.8%. However, this has reduced to 7.5%. The fees and chargesfor 2022-23 financial year were also adopted as part of this process.

At the meeting, Central Otago Mayor Tim Cadogan believed this was a good result, a view he reiterated on his Facebook Live post this week.

"To do the things we have committed to doing in the Long-term Plan last year after significant consultation with the

community, we were anticipating a 7.8% average rate rise which has come back to 7.5%. That is not a bad effort compared to the current rate of inflation, although rates and inflation aren't totally directly linked.

"This is an average rate rise and different areas and different types of properties will have a different level of rise that make up the average. For instance, the Teviot Vallev rates increase will be higher due to the impact of the funding agreed last year for the new swimming pool.

"Council has chosen not to reduce any levels of service across the organisation, which is what would have been required to bring the rise back further."

CODC Executive Manager Corporate Services Leanne Macdonald said the

Council had also seen increased costs relating to wastewater and waste (rubbish) collection and disposal.

Wastewater and waste minimisation had increased in year two of the LTP as predicted. This created differences across

the district as well, she said.

"For example, Clyde currently does not pay the wastewater uniform charge of \$601.94, so will not feel the impact of this increase. Hotels and motels that have additional pans will feel the increase of wastewater more than residential ratepayers, who do not get charged for additional pans. Ratepayers who have rubbish bins included in their rates for the first time will feel a greater impact of rising waste collection costs. These variances can be across the ward, and also across ratepayers within the district depending on their individual circumstances; this causes anomalies in our average rates increase.

"Finally, waste collection has also increased, so our bins increased by 6% from \$448 to \$475 for a set of three bins and the waste management charge went from \$69.92 to \$73.98, so while not much in terms of dollars, is still a 5.8% increase in this area. The good news story to this is of course that we need to drive our waste down in order to reduce cost. So, we need to keep encouraging that."

The ward-specific rates were set for Māniatoto as a 0.4% decrease-average across the district and Teviot a 5.2% increase., Cromwell ward-specific average rates increase was 4.1% and Vincent wardspecifics average rates increase was 5%.

"These variances reflect the various ward specific projects going on in their areas.

It should be noted that increases or decreases are specific to these communities and do not include the district-wide charges and metered water charges."
